CMAS

1. **GENERAL PRINCIPLES**

- 1.1. The CMAS General Rules will be applied.
- 1.2. The CMAS World Cup Finswimming Indoor will include all international invitation swimming-pool meetings that will have been granted a CMAS permit. The calendar of the races of the Cup will be proposed by the CMAS Finswimming Commission (CMAS FC) and will be diffused by the CMAS HQ after BoD vote.
- 1.3. The meetings will undergo an annual CMAS FC evaluation.
- 1.4. The CMAS World Cup Finswimming Indoor consists of a minimum of 3 rounds.
- 1.5. There must be a minimum gap of three weeks (19 days), between consecutive rounds.
- 1.6. There must be a minimum round per Continent. In case that a Continent cannot host it the Finswimming Commission will decide the new place.
- 1.7. In the CMAS World Cup Finswimming Indoor, only National Teams and clubs can participate.
- 1.8. All clubs and/or athlete, have the right to participate, except when their respective National Federation does not allow this. In these cases the National Federation must inform CMAS in writing, explaining the reason for their opposition concerning the club or the athlete(s).
- 1.9. CMAS does not return the entry fee, when the club entry is cancelled or blocked by the National Federation
- 1.10. The CMAS World Cup Finswimming Indoor will include:
 - **Junior:** Category (B, C, D).
 - **Senior:** Category (A).
- 1.11. The CMAS World Cup Finswimming Indoor will include the following events:
 - **Male:** 50AP, 100IM, 200IM, 400IM, 50SF, 100SF, 200SF, 400SF, 800SF, 1500SF, 50BF, 100BF, 200BF, 400BF, 4X100SF, 4x100SB mixed
 - **Female:** 50AP, 100IM, 200IM, 400IM, 50SF, 100SF, 200SF, 400SF, 800SF, 1500SF, 50BF, 100BF, 200BF, 400BF, 4X100SF, 4x100SB mixed
- 1.12. Each competitor can take part in a maximum of four (4) individual races and two (2) relays.
- 1.13. Each competitor can participate for only one club during the year (precision: participation in National Team is not considered as participation for a club. Thus, a competitor has the right to compete during different rounds in the same year for his club or his national team according the corresponding point in “CMAS general rules”).
- 1.14. Each National Team or club can enrol a maximum of four swimmers for each individual race. If a National Team or a Club wish to have an athlete participate in more than four individual races, they must declare when they register the athlete which are the additional events. The athlete is entered as “Out of Race” and in this case, no point and classification rank will be applied for these additional races.
- 1.15. A CMAS World Cup Finswimming Indoor should be staged at one venue during five sessions, see **APPENDIX 6**.
- 1.16. Organizers are free to stage any event in addition to the above competitions. The request must be sent at the same time as the candidature for acceptance by the Finswimming Commission. In all cases, this type of additional events will be programmed only at the end of the considered session after awarding ceremonies of the world cup.

2. **ORGANISATION**

- 2.1. The organiser of a race must have received the national federation’s agreement. It is the national federation that submits the candidature according to the CMAS rules (before June

30th of previous years).

- 2.2. Every organiser will have to forward the particular regulation with all the necessary information (the price of accommodation etc....) at the latest ten (10) weeks before the event to all the national federations associated with CMAS and the CMAS HQ. Every national federation has the responsibility to send the information to its clubs.
- 2.3. For every meeting, CMAS can send a CMAS Technical Delegate. In that case, the delegate will be in charge of the Organizer.

3. **CMAS WORLD CUP FINSWIMMING INDOOR CLASSIFICATION**

- 3.1. There will be classification for Individuals, Clubs, National Teams and Countries.
- 3.2. Individual: There will be, for every distance, four different individual classifications for Senior and Junior, men and women. Swimmers registered by Clubs or National Teams are in this classification.
- 3.3. Club: The general classification will be made by the total amount of the individual point (men and women, junior and senior only registered by clubs). Four separate Club Classification will be made also for senior men, senior women, junior boys and junior girls.
- 3.4. National Teams: The general classification will be made by the total amount of the individual point (men and women, junior and senior). Four separate National Teams Classification will be made also for men, women, juniors' boys, juniors' girls.
- 3.5. Countries Ranking:
 - 3.5.1. The Countries Ranking will be made in accordance with points 1.9 and 1.11 by the total amount of the individual points (men and women, junior and senior) of National Teams.
 - 3.5.2. If a National Federation does not enrol its National team, the best two results by club in accordance with points 1.9 and 1.11 at each distance, at each category (men, woman, junior and senior) will go for the Countries ranking.
- 3.6. For every race of the CMAS World Cup Finswimming Indoor, the classification will be according the following CMAS Swimming-Pool Individual Point Table:

All other swimmers who finish the race will receive 1 point for successful participation.

4. **CMAS WORLD CUP FINSWIMMING INDOOR - GENERAL CLASSIFICATION**

- 4.1. All competitors can participate in all the races of the World Cup Finswimming Indoor.
- 4.2. The General Individual Classification will be made as an addition of three best results.
- 4.3. There will be four different General Individual Classification for the best men, women, boys and girls. Swimmers registered by Clubs or Nationals' Teams are in this classification.
- 4.4. There will be also, for every distance four different General Individual Classification for men, women, senior and junior. Swimmers registered by Clubs or Nationals' Teams are in this classification.
- 4.5. The Club General Classification will be made by the total amount of the individual points of the best three Meeting results.

- 4.6. Four separate Club General Classification will be made also for men, women, senior and junior.
- 4.7. The Nationals Teams Classification will be made by the total amount of the individual points of the best three Meeting results.
- 4.8. The Countries Classification will be made by total amount of the individual point of the best three Meeting results.

5. **AWARDS**

- 5.1. For every round of the CMAS World Cup Finswimming Indoor (in charge of the organizer):
 - Gold, silver and bronze medals for each distance, men and women, senior and junior.
 - It's up to the organizer to give money prizes.
 - All participant clubs and National Teams will receive an award.
- 5.2. For the General CMAS World Cup Finswimming Indoor Classification (in charge of CMAS):
 - Individual: Gold, silver and bronze medals for the best men, women, senior and junior.
 - Club: A Cup for the club who that wins the General World Cup Classification.
 - National Teams: A Cup for the National Team that wins the General World Cup Classification

6. **ENTRY TO THE CMAS WORLD CUP FINSWIMMING INDOOR**

- 6.1. A preliminary Entry Form must be sent to the Organizer and to the CMAS HQ at the latest 6 weeks before the event.
- 6.2. After this deadline, a penalty will be applied from the organising committee.
- 6.3. The final registration must be done on the CMAS Portal
- 6.4. Withdrawal can be announced not later than 5 days before the competition.
- 6.5. A 50,00 Euro fee will be paid to the organizer for a swimmer who declares withdrawal after this time.

7. **CMAS RIGHTS**

- 7.1. Competitions are organised under the exclusive control of CMAS, and all rights are and will be the property of CMAS.

8. **RESULTS**

- 8.1. The Organizer must:
 - Give one copy of the results to all National Teams and clubs.
 - Send one copy of the results to the CMAS HQ.

9. **PROTEST**

- 9.1. CMAS Rules will be applied.

10. **OFFICIAL PRESENTATION OF DOCUMENTS**

For all documents (start lists and results), the presentation must be:

- In one of the three languages of CMAS, only
- According to the following examples:

You must add the name of the country (IOC format conform) before the name of the club:
